A. TODAY'S AIR QUALITY INDEX ratings and meaning:

Current measurement/rating: Branch of Natural Resources (PM2.5): 176

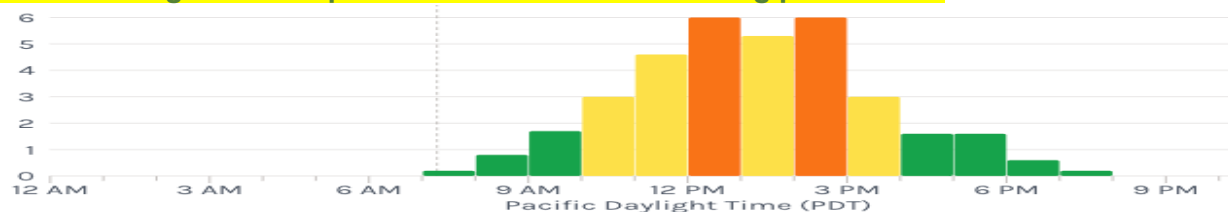

B. FORECAST:

Patchy smoke. Sunny through mid-morning, then becoming partly sunny, with a high near 91. Calm wind becoming north 5 to 8 mph in the afternoon.

- C. The UV Index in Warm Springs will continue to rise, reaching a moderate level of 3 between 10:00 AM - 11:00 AM and a high level of 6 between 12:00 PM - 1:00 PM. The UV Index will peak between 12:00 PM and 1:00 PM with a high reading of 6. For the protection of your health against UV exposure, we highly recommended wearing sunglasses, generously applying broad-spectrum SPF 15+ strength sunscreen on exposed skin, covering the body with sun-protective clothing and a wide-brim hat, and reducing the time spent outdoors in the sun during peak hours.

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- **AQI Scale: The Air Quality Index (AQI) ranges from 0 to 500, indicating air quality levels from good to hazardous:**
- **Good (0-50): Air quality is satisfactory; poses little or no risk to health.**
- **Moderate (51-100): Air quality is acceptable; some pollutants may be a concern for a small number of people.**
- **Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups (101-150): Members of sensitive groups may experience health effects; the general public is unlikely to be affected.**
- **Unhealthy (151-200): Everyone may begin to experience health effects; members of sensitive groups may experience more serious effects.**
- **Very Unhealthy (201-300): Health alert; everyone may experience more serious health effects.**
- **Hazardous (301-500): Health warnings of emergency conditions; the entire population is more likely to be affected.**
